National Reconciliation Week 2023

The theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023, Be a Voice for Generations, encourages all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives – where we live, work and socialise.

Solomontown Primary School learnt about reconciliation in each class during the week, as well as planned experiences through the Aboriginal Education Team. The activities included:



- Rock painting where children talked about the use of art for storytelling through symbols by Aboriginal People
- Damper tasting where we spoke about traditional ingredients and processes to make 'bushbread'
- Biscuit making in the flag colours - children looked at Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags and their colour meanings
- Sand art using symbols and tracks for storytelling
- Rainbow serpent colouring at break time engaging with dream stories.

We were also lucky enough to have a special visitor, Lillian Crombie who came and shared storytelling and dance with children during the break as well as the year 5 and 6 classes. We had Kelly Bray come in during break time and teach the children weaving using traditional techniques. We thank our special guests for their time, we are very lucky to have community members dedicated to sharing their culture with the future generations.
